Hebrew	The word הִיְהִיָּה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 זָב מִבְּשָׁלוֹ זֹכֵב טִמֵּא הוּא
ESV	“Speak to the people of Israel and say to them, When any man has a discharge from his body, his discharge is unclean.
NIV	“Speak to the Israelites and say to them: ‘When any man has a bodily discharge, the discharge is unclean.
NLT	“Give the following instructions to the people of Israel.”Any man who has a bodily discharge is ceremonially unclean.

Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ἀνδρὶ ἀνδρὶ ᾧ greek Meaning: * Who * Which * What The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent). It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἐὰν γένηται ῥύσις ἐκ τοῦ greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ἀκάθαρτός ἐστιν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g.
