ESV	And anyone who touches his bed shall wash his clothes and bathe himself in water and be unclean until the evening.
NIV	Anyone who touches his bed must wash his clothes and bathe with water, and he will be unclean till evening.
NLT	So if you touch the man's bed, you must wash your clothes and bathe yourself in water, and you will remain unclean until evening.

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἔως ἑσπέρας
