Demonstrative pronoun.

οὔτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 ἐξιλιάσεται περὶ ὑμῶν καθαρίσαι ὑμᾶς ἀπὸ πασῶνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigπᾶς

Adjective.

Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as
