	הָיָה֩ אִישׁ֨ אֲשֶׁר־יִהְיֶה֩ hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 בּוֹ שֹׁבֵר רֶגֶל א֤וֹ שֹׁבֵר יָד֙
ESV	or a man who has an injured foot or an injured hand,
NIV	no man with a crippled foot or hand,
NLT	or has a broken foot or arm,
LXX	ἢ ἄνθρωπος ὃς ἐστίν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. αὐτῷ greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) σύντριμμα χειρὸς ἢ σύντριμμα ποδός
