	הִיְהִיָּה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigהִיְהִיָּה hebrew The word הִיְהִיָּה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לָא תַעֲשׂוּ לָכֶם כָּל מִלְאכָת עֲבֹדָה
ESV	On the first day you shall have a holy convocation; you shall not do any ordinary work.
NIV	On the first day hold a sacred assembly and do no regular work.
NLT	On the first day of the festival, all the people must stop their ordinary work and observe an official day for holy assembly.

Usage in the New Testament The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
