It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ.Genesis 1:1 שְׁמָּיִם עֶשְׂרֵבִּׁים יָהְיֶה

	The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 הַחַלֵּה הָאָמֶת
ESV	"You shall take fine flour and bake twelve loaves from it; two tenths of an ephah shall be in each loaf.
NIV	"Take fine flour and bake twelve loaves of bread, using two-tenths of an ephah for each loaf.
NLT	"You must bake twelve loaves of bread from choice flour, using four quarts of flour for each loaf.
