### Meaning

\* Yahweh - God's personal name

It is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word יְהוָּה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

## hebrew

The Hebrew, אַת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. Noun. Masculine. Although it looks plural in form (ending in ים-), it is almost always used as a singular in meaning - a type of plural of intensity or plural of form common in Hebrew for body parts that come in pairs or have multiple aspects. הַכֹּמָן

Usage in the New Testament

The sense of  $\pi \tilde{\alpha} c$  depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).

lt is distinct from ὅτι ("that," introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning οὐ προσφέρεται ἀπ αὐτῶνplugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip\_bigαὐτός
