Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” [Ϝplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big](#)ός, ἥ, ὅ

The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).

It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἐάν ἐπιρραντισθῇ [ἀπὸ τοῦ](#) [plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big](#)ό, ἥ, τό
