The Hebrew אתַּךְ word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בְּרָא אֱלֹהִים ( הַחַיָּה וְהַיְבֵרֶת וְהַתְּנוּפָה לִפְנֵי הַיְהוָה ) plugin-autotooltip\_\_default plugin-autotooltip\_big

Meaning

\* Yahweh - God's personal name

It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word יהוָה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

Hebrew

The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.

This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.

\* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 הָיָה כְּאִשֶּׁר צִוָּה יְהוָה plugin-autotooltip\_\_default plugin-autotooltip\_big

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For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בְּרָא אֱלֹהִים ( מְשֹׁה )

ESV	And Moses took the breast and waved it for a wave offering before the LORD. It was Moses' portion of the ram of ordination, as the LORD commanded Moses.
NIV	He also took the breast-Moses' share of the ordination ram-and waved it before the LORD as a wave offering, as the LORD commanded Moses.
NLT	Then Moses took the breast and lifted it up as a special offering to the LORD. This was Moses' portion of the ram of ordination, just as the LORD had commanded him.
