IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἀπῆλθεν ἀπ’ αὐτῆςplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. KJV	And Mary said, Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word. And the angel departed from her.

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
