	Adjective.	
	Usage in the New Testament	
	The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.	
	With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 καθαρὰ ὑμῖν

	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).	
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g.	
ESV	But give as alms those things that are within, and behold, everything is clean for you.	
NIV	But give what is inside the dish to the poor, and everything will be clean for you.	
NLT	So clean the inside by giving gifts to the poor, and you will be clean all over.	
KJV	But rather give alms of such things as ye have; and, behold, all things are clean unto you.	

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
