Greek	λέγοντες ὅτι οὗτος greek Meaning: * These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it Demonstrative pronoun. οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 ὁ greek The definite article ἄνθρωπος ἤρξατο οἰκοδομεῖν καὶ autotooltip_bigαὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” οὐκ ἴσχυσεν ἐκτελέσαι.
	ESV saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.'
	NIV saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.'
	NLT They would say, 'There's the person who started that building and couldn't afford to finish it!'
	KJV Saying, This man began to build, and was not able to finish.

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
