Sometimes it functions as a indefinitely pronoun (“someone” or “a certain one”). It agrees in gender, number and case with the noun it modifies. Occurs a little under 350 times in the New Testament.Matthew 8:19John 10:30 Φαρισαῖος καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ὁ greek The definite article ἕτερος τελώνης.
ESV	“Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.
NIV	“Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.
NLT	“Two men went to the Temple to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a despised tax collector.
