IT is most frequently translated as “and” προδραμὼν εἰς τὸ greek Meaning: * The Greek The definite article. Forms Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ ἔμπροσθεν ἀνέβη ἐπὶ συκομορέαν, ἵνα ἴδῃ αὐτόν, greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ὅτι ἐκείνης ἡμελλεν διέρχεσθαι.
ESV	So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was about to pass that way.
NIV	So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree to see him, since Jesus was coming that way.
NLT	So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree beside the road, for Jesus was going to pass that way.
KJV	And he ran before, and climbed up into a sycomore tree to see him: for he was to pass that way.
