Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐπὶ γῆς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big γῆ

Meaning:

* Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5)

Feminine noun. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”.

It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 εἰρήνη ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ἐν
