Usage in the New Testament

The sense of $\pi \tilde{\alpha} \zeta$ depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).

lt is distinct from ὅτι ("that," introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning δ'plugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_bigδέ

δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "and" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἂν πέση, λικμήσει αὐτόν.plugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English)

ESV	Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces, and when it falls on anyone, it will crush him."
NIV	Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces, but he on whom it falls will be crushed."
NLT	Everyone who stumbles over that stone will be broken to pieces, and it will crush anyone it falls on."
KJV	Whosoever shall fall upon that stone shall be broken; but on whomsoever it shall fall, it will grind him to powder.
