IT is most frequently translated as “and” προφάσει μακρὰ προσεύχονται· οὗτοι αὐτοῦτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο greek Meaning: * These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it Demonstrative pronoun. οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 λήμψονται περισσότερον κρίμα.
ESV	who devour widows' houses and for a pretense make long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation.”
NIV	They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. Such men will be punished most severely.”
NLT	Yet they shamelessly cheat widows out of their property and then pretend to be pious by making long prayers in public. Because of this, they will be severely punished.”
KJV	Which devour widows' houses, and for a shew make long prayers: the same shall receive greater damnation.

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
