Meaning:	
* The sky * Air * Heaven or heavens	
278 occurrences in the New Testament.	
Οὐρανός is used in Scripture to describe the sky and universe (that is, the visible expanse above the earth) as well as the transcendent realm where God is present. For example, in Matthew 6:26Matthew 24:29Matthew 6:9 σαλευθήσονται.	
ESV	people fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world. For the powers of the heavens will be shaken.
NIV	Men will faint from terror, apprehensive of what is coming on the world, for the heavenly bodies will be shaken.
NLT	People will be terrified at what they see coming upon the earth, for the powers in the heavens will be shaken.
KJV	Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken.

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
