	Meaning
	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So
	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἦσαν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί
	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. διαπαντὸς ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν

	Preposition meaning “in”. τῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ

	The definite article ἐν ᾧ αἰνοῦντες τὸν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ
	greek
	The definite article θεόν .plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigθεὸς
	greek
	Masculine noun meaning:
	* A god or goddess * God
