Usage in the New Testament The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable. ESV	“Woe to you, when all people speak well of you, for so their fathers did to the false prophets.
NIV	Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for that is how their fathers treated the false prophets.
NLT	What sorrow awaits you who are praised by the crowds, for their ancestors also praised false prophets.
KJV	Woe unto you, when all men shall speak well of you! for so did their fathers to the false prophets.
