Greek Usage in the New Testament The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable. ESV	A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher.
NIV	A student is not above his teacher, but everyone who is fully trained will be like his teacher.
NLT	Students are not greater than their teacher. But the student who is fully trained will become like the teacher.
KJV	The disciple is not above his master: but every one that is perfect shall be as his master.
