Greek Usage in the New Testament

The sense of $\pi \tilde{\alpha} \varsigma$ depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

INII I	Students are not greater than their teacher. But the student who is fully trained will become like the teacher.
KJV	The disciple is not above his master: but every one that is perfect shall be as his master.
