Verb forms Present tense Person Greek Form ὁμοίως ἐστίνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”.
