It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. Sometimes it functions as a indefinitely pronoun (“someone” or “a certain one”). It agrees in gender, number and case with the noun it modifies. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἕτερος πεντήκοντα.

NIV	"Two men owed money to a certain moneylender. One owed him five hundred denarii, and the other fifty.
NLT	Then Jesus told him this story: "A man loaned money to two people- 500 pieces of silver to one and 50 pieces to the other.
KJV	There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty.

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
