δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "and" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἔτερος πεντήκοντα.

ESV "A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty.

NIV	"Two men owed money to a certain moneylender. One owed him five hundred denarii, and the other fifty.
NLT	Then Jesus told him this story: "A man loaned money to two people- 500 pieces of silver to one and 50 pieces to the other.
