	οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19

	δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. μύρω ἔλειψεν μου τοὺς

	The definite article πόδας.	
ESV	You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment.	
NIV	You did not put oil on my head, but she has poured perfume on my feet.	
NLT	You neglected the courtesy of olive oil to anoint my head, but she has anointed my feet with rare perfume.	
KJV	My head with oil thou didst not anoint: but this woman hath anointed my feet with ointment.	

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
