	Meaning:
	* Beginning * First * Elementary * Rulers, rule, domain
	Noun, feminine (first declension)
	Occurs 56 times in the New Testament, consistently conveying the idea of primacy - whether temporal (i.e. the start, e.g. John 1:1) or causal (i.e. the source) or governmental (i.e. the ruler, e.g. Ephesians 6:12 τοῦ
	greek
	The definite article εὐαγγελίου
ESV	Means “good news” or “gospel” Ἰησοῦ Χριστοῦ,
	autotooltip_bigΧριστός
	Christ means “anointed one”
	The equivalent Hebrew word is Messiah (מָשִׁיחַ)
NIV	Noun, masculine.
	The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
	The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
	This is the Good News about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God. It began
NLT	The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God;

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
