Related to the verb λέγω. λόγος in Greek Thought Before the New Testament, λόγος already had deep philosophical use. In Greek philosophy, λόγος was the rational principle that ordered the universe, the divine reason that structured all things. In Heraclitus, λόγος referred to the unifying rational principle behind the constant change in the world.... ἀπῆλθεν λυπούμενος· ἦνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. γὰρ ἔχων κτήματα πολλά. ESV Disheartened by the saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.
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NIV	At this the man's face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth.
NLT	At this the man's face fell, and he went away very sad, for he had many possessions.
KJV	And he was sad at that saying, and went away grieved: for he had great possessions.
