	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἢ ἐξ ἀνθρώπων; ἀποκρίθητέ μοι.
ESV	Was the baptism of John from heaven or from man? Answer me."
NIV	John's baptism–was it from heaven, or from men? Tell me!"
NLT	"Did John's authority to baptize come from heaven, or was it merely human? Answer me!"
KJV	The baptism of John, was it from heaven, or of men? answer me.
