Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” [μετὰ μικρὸν πάλιν οἱ](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοἱ

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

εἶμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. [καὶ](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί
