

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example $\epsilon l\mu l$ is the word for am and $\tilde{l} \nu$ is the word for was, e.g. $\tau \delta plugin$ -autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip big δ , $\dot{\eta}$, $\tau \delta$
