Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν

Preposition meaning “in”. ταῖς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

The definite article συναγωγᾷς αὐτῶν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
