IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐν ἑξ αὐτῶν greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Greek Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) οὐ πεσεῖται ἐπὶ τὴν greek The definite article γῆν Meaning: * Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5) Feminine noun. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”. It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 ἄνευ τοῦ greek The definite article πατρὸς ὑμῶν.
ESV	Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father.
NIV	Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from the will of your Father.
NLT	What is the price of two sparrows— one copper coin? But not a single sparrow can fall to the ground without your Father knowing it.
KJV	Are not two sparrows sold for a farthing? and one of them shall not fall on the ground without your Father.

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
