The definite article **φιλῶν πατέρα ἢ μητέρα ὑπὲρ ἐμὲ οὐκ ἔστιν** **εἰμί**

greek

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (**εἶναι** [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example **εἰμί** is the word for am and **ἦν** is the word for was, e.g. **μου ἄξιος, καὶ**

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” **ὅ**
