	Meaning: * To do * To make This verb - to do or make - is used in connection with a large range of activities including creation, covenant formation, obedience, miracles, sin and worship. Verb forms Present tense Person Greek Form
ESV	Of how much more value is a man than a sheep! So it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath.”
NIV	How much more valuable is a man than a sheep! Therefore it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath.”
NLT	And how much more valuable is a person than a sheep! Yes, the law permits a person to do good on the Sabbath.”
KJV	How much then is a man better than a sheep? Wherefore it is lawful to do well on the sabbath days.
