ESV	δὲ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. σαπρὰ ἔξω ἔβαλον.

	NIV	
	When it was full, the fishermen pulled it up on the shore. Then they sat down and collected the good fish in baskets, but threw the bad away.	
	NLT	
	When the net was full, they dragged it up onto the shore, sat down, and sorted the good fish into crates, but threw the bad ones away.	
KJV	Which, when it was full, they drew to shore, and sat down, and gathered the good into vessels, but cast the bad away.	

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
