Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

Meaning

* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἰδοὺ φωνὴ ἐκ τῆς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

The definite article νεφέλης λέγουσα· οὗτός plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὗτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο

Meaning:

* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 ἐστὶν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ὁ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

Preposition meaning “in”. ὧ ἐὺδόκησα· ἀκούετε αὐτοῦ. plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

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
