Adjective.

Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 [καὶ](#)[plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big](#)[καί](#)

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" [ἡκολουθήσαμέν σοι· τί ἄρα ἔσται](#)[plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big](#)[εἰμί](#)

greek

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἡμῶν;

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
