Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

Meaning:

* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 ἐγενήθη plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigγενίνομαι

Meaning

* To Become * To Come into being * Generate * To Happen * Brought to pass

Verb.

Different from εἶμι (which means “to be” - a state of existence); γίνομαι, instead, emphasizes coming to be - a transition or event. John 1:14 John 1:3 Matthew 6:10 εἰς κεφαλὴν γωνίας· παρὰ κυρίου ἐγένετο plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big γίνομαι

Meaning

* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἔστιν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἶμι

greek

εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. θαυμαστὴ ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ἐν
