εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. δύο ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν

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Preposition meaning “in”. τῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὀ

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The definite article ὁ γρῶ, εἷς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἷς

εἷς is the cardinal number (“one”). Sometimes it functions as a indefinitely pronoun (“someone” or “a certain one”). It agrees in gender, number and case with the noun it modifies.
