	ἔδωκαν αὐτῷ greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
Greek	Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) πεῖν οἶνον μετὰ χολῆς μεμιγμένον· καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" γευσάμενος οὐκ ἠθέλησεν πεῖν.
ESV	they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall, but when he tasted it, he would not drink it.
NIV	There they offered Jesus wine to drink, mixed with gall; but after tasting it, he refused to drink it.
NLT	The soldiers gave him wine mixed with bitter gall, but when he had tasted it, he refused to drink it.
KJV	They gave him vinegar to drink mingled with gall: and when he had tasted thereof, he would not drink.
