Greek	greek Preposition meaning “in”. ἐαυτοῖς· οὗτοςplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὗτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο greek Meaning: * These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it Demonstrative pronoun. οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 βλασφημεῖ.
ESV	And behold, some of the scribes said to themselves, “This man is blaspheming.”
NIV	At this, some of the teachers of the law said to themselves, “This fellow is blaspheming!”
NLT	But some of the teachers of religious law said to themselves, “That's blasphemy! Does he think he's God?”
KJV	And, behold, certain of the scribes said within themselves, This man blasphemeth.
