	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. εὐκοπώτερον, εἰπεῖν, ἀφίενταί σου αἱ

NLT	Is it easier to say 'Your sins are forgiven,' or 'Stand up and walk'?	
KJV	For whether is easier, to say, Thy sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Arise, and walk?	

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
