ESV	These were the names of the men whom Moses sent to spy out the land. And Moses called Hoshea the son of Nun Joshua.
NIV	These are the names of the men Moses sent to explore the land. (Moses gave Hoshea son of Nun the name Joshua.)
NLT	These are the names of the men Moses sent out to explore the land. (Moses called Hoshea son of Nun by the name Joshua.)
