	The Hebrew את word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.
	For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by אֶרֶץ Hebrew hebrew
	Meaning: * Earth (e.g. Genesis 1:1) or world * Land * Countries or country
	The word אַרְצ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground. When coupled with heavens (שָׁמַיִם), the phrase indicates the entire created order.Genesis 12:1 לָנֹעַן וְאֵשֶׁר אֲנִי נָתַן לְבְנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל אִישׁ אֶחָד מֵאַחַד לְמִסְטָה אֲבֹתָיו תִּשְׁלָחוּ כָּל גִּזְוֵיהֶם
ESV	"Send men to spy out the land of Canaan, which I am giving to the people of Israel. From each tribe of their fathers you shall send a man, every one a chief among them."
NIV	"Send some men to explore the land of Canaan, which I am giving to the Israelites. From each ancestral tribe send one of its leaders."
NLT	"Send out men to explore the land of Canaan, the land I am giving to the Israelites. Send one leader from each of the twelve ancestral tribes."

IT is most frequently translated as “and” κατασκεψάσθωσαν τὴν greek The definite article γῆν Meaning: * Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5) Feminine noun. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”.
