ESV	And every open vessel that has no cover fastened on it is unclean.
NIV	and every open container without a lid fastened on it will be unclean.
NLT	Any open container in the tent that was not covered with a lid is also defiled.

	Meaning
	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So
	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and”
	πᾶν
	greek
	Meaning
	* All * Every * The whole
	Adjective.
LXX	Usage in the New Testament
	The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
	With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17
	σκεῦος ἀνεωγμένον ὅσα οὐχὶ δεσμὸν καταδέδεταί ἐπ αὐτῷ
	greek
	Meaning
	* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same
	Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
	Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English)
	ἀκάθαρτά ἐστιν
LXX	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g.
KJV	And every open vessel, which hath no covering bound upon it, is unclean.
