	הִיְהִי plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big הִיְהִי hebrew The word הִיְהִי means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לָכֵן כָּל מְלָאכָת עֲבֹדָה לֹא תַעֲשׂוּ
ESV	And on the seventh day you shall have a holy convocation. You shall not do any ordinary work.
NIV	On the seventh day hold a sacred assembly and do no regular work.
NLT	The seventh day of the festival will be another official day for holy assembly, and no ordinary work may be done on that day.

	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and”

	The definite article ήμέρα ή plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigό

	The definite article έβδομη κλητη άγια εσται plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigείμι
	greek
	είμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (είναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example είμι is the word for am and ήν is the word for was, e.g. ύμιν πάν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigπας

	* All * Every * The whole
	Adjective.
	Usage in the New Testament
	The sense of πας depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
	With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 εργον λατρευτον ού ποιήσετε plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigποιέω

	This verb - to do or make - is used in connection with a large range of activities including creation, covenant formation, obedience, miracles, sin and worship.

	Preposition meaning “in”. αύτῃ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαύτός

	Meaning
	* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same
	Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
