In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. Hebrew	hebrew Meaning * Yahweh - God's personal name It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word יְהוָה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.
