ESV	And if he struck him down with a stone tool that could cause death, and he died, he is a murderer. The murderer shall be put to death.
NIV	Or if anyone has a stone in his hand that could kill, and he strikes someone so that he dies, he is a murderer; the murderer shall be put to death.
NLT	Or if someone with a stone in his hand strikes and kills another person, it is murder, and the murderer must be put to death.

	ἐάνδεplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigδέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἐνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigέν greek Preposition meaning “in”. λίθω ἐκ χειρός ἐνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigέν greek Preposition meaning “in”. ὧplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigός, ἡ, ὃ greek Meaning: * Who * Which * What The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent). It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἀποθανέϊται ἐνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigέν greek Preposition meaning “in”. αὐτῷplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἀποθάνῃ φονευτής ἐστίνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
