NIV	In all you must give the Levites forty-eight towns, together with their pasturelands.
NLT	In all, forty-eight towns with the surrounding pastureland will be given to the Levites.

Usage in the New Testament The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
